How Do I Know if My Child Has Been Exposed to Lead?

Message I: A little lead can cause BIG problems. Act early! Blood lead testing is required for children with Medicaid at I & 2 years old & recommended for all higher risk children at these ages. Message 2: #DYK children with lead poisoning usually do not look or act sick? Ask your healthcare provider about getting your child tested.
