

# What is an injury?

The physical damage to a human body from a sudden exposure to an amount of energy greater than what can be physiologically tolerated or from lack vital elements, such as oxygen (WHO, 2007).

## Injuries are identified by intent.

### Intentional

- Injuries that occur as a result of violence or intent of harm.
- Can be directed at:
  - o One's self
  - Others
  - Groups
- <u>Includes:</u> homicide, suicide, sexual assault, domestic violence, some firearm related injuries, & others

### Unintentional

- Unplanned Injuries where the outcome causing damage was not sought
- Includes: drowning, falls, motor-vehicle and traffic related injuries, poisoning, burns, traumatic brain injury, & more

The **mechanism of injury** is the way in which the person was injured or the process by which the injury occurred.

or

No matter the mechanism or intent, all injuries are <u>preventable</u>.

## Why prevent injuries?

### The high burden to society

- Injuries result in severe, painful emotional & physical health outcomes.
  - These can be short-term, longterm, or permanent.

(U.S. DHHS, 2021)

- Unintentional injuries in Iowa:
  - Are the 4th leading cause of death for all ages
  - Are the leading cause of death for ages 1-44

(CDC's WISQARS, 2019)


- In Iowa annually, injuries and violence resulted in an annual average of:
  - o 2,100 deaths
  - 17,200 hospitalizations,
  - 257,000 emergency department visits

(IDPH, 2016-2019)

### The monetary cost

- Injuries can result in a high cost to lowans
- Average annual charges can be up to:
  - \$43,200 per hospitalization
  - \$2,700 per emergency department visit
