- Priority for support will be given to individuals who are currently working the in the fields
 of child welfare, domestic violence or behavioral health (e.g. substance use disorder
 treatment, mental health services). Members of the Advisory Council on Brain Injuries
 are encouraged to apply.
- Priority will be given to individuals who have not received this scholarship in the past.
