HCV Screening: 2021


The Integrated Testing Services (ITS) program administered 1,131 Hepatitis C (HCV) tests across 12 participating agencies in 2021.

This represents an increase of 41% from 2020, while remaining 29% under the fiveyear average of 1,587 tests per year.

While total screening numbers have not yet returned to pre-pandemic levels, the HCV positivity rate (calculated by those individuals identified as having an active viral load) for 2021 was 2.83%, slightly higher than the 5-year average of 2.71%.


The majority of individuals with confirmed chronic HCV in 2021 (88%) reported a history of injection drug use. The remaining 12% comprised baby boomers (6%) and individuals without prioritized population classification (6%).

ITS HCV Testing and Positivity 2017 - 2021



In 2021, diagnoses at ITS sites accounted for 4.3% of all reported HCV cases (slightly higher than the 5-year average of 3.68%) with 88% of those diagnosed in these settings reporting a history of injection drug use. This highlights the capacity of these projects to engage those who experience an increased risk of HCV transmission.
