
# HIV and HCV Prevention Program Snapshot Program-Supported HIV and HCV Testing: 2021

The HIV and Hepatitis Prevention Program partners with a variety of stakeholders to support strategic implementation of HIV and HCV screening services across lowa.

## In 2021, **17,407 rapid and conventional HIV tests** were administered in partnership with 72 agencies across six major settings.

- 12 Integrated Testing Services Agencies contracted by the IDPH to provide targeted clinical and outreach based testing;
- 12 Federally Qualified Health Centers working to implement routine screening in partnership with the lowa Primary Care Association;
- **22 Community-based Screening Services** projects working with the IDPH and Family Planning Council to provide safetynet STD screening services;
- **14 Substance Use Treatment** locations integrating HIV screening into medically assisted treatment programs;
- 11 Community-based Pharmacies providing free rapid testing in partnership with the Iowa Pharmacy Association; and
- 10 State Disease Intervention Specialists providing free rapid and confirmatory HIV testing to individuals engaged in partner services.


### **Prevention Program Total HIV Testing and Positivity**

The program reported a 0.24% total positivity rate in 2021, down only slightly from the 0.25% rate in 2020.

#### **Prevention Program Total HCV Testing and Positivity**

In 2021, **7,445 rapid and conventional HCV tests** were administered in partnership with 60 agencies across four major settings.

- 12 Integrated Testing Services Agencies contracted by the IDPH to provide clinical and outreach based testing prioritizing individuals with a history of injection drug use and those born between 1945 and 1965;
- **22 Community-based Screening Services** projects working with the IDPH and Family Planning Council to provide safety-net STD screening services;
- 12 Federally Qualified Health Centers working to implement routine screening in partnership with the Iowa Primary Care Association; and
- **14 Substance Use Treatment** locations integrating HCV screening into medically assisted treatment programs.

The program reported a 3.06% total positivity rate in 2021, down slightly from the 3.69% rate in 2020. Substance use treatment settings remain the greatest opportunity to identify individuals living with HCV in Iowa.
