



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PrEP is a single pill that helps keep you HIV negative when taken once daily as prescribed by your provider. Depending on risk factors, it is estimated that it takes 7-20 days for PrEP to reach

effective levels of protection.

PrEP might be right for you if you are HIV negative and can answer YES to any of the following questions:

- Do you have multiple sex partners? • Do you have sex without condoms?
- Are any of your sexual partners living with HIV or of unknown HIV status?
 - Have you had a sexually transmitted infection in the past year?
 - Do you share needles to inject drugs?
 - Do you exchange sex for money, food, drugs, housing or anything else you need?

PrEP is most effective when used with condoms.

- For maximum effectiveness, PrEP must be taken daily.
- PrEP does NOT protect against any other STIs.
- · While on PrEP, individuals are required to be seen by a medical provider at least every 90 days.
- · PrEP may cause side effects (nausea, vomiting, fatigue, dizziness, headache), usually only lasting a month.
- · Individuals may qualify for financial assistance to help offset the cost of PrEP.
