Re: Designation of Acute Flaccid Myelitis as temporarily reportable

Date Issued: December 29, 2022

Pursuant to 641 Iowa Administrative Code I.3 (139A), I, as the Director of the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services, temporarily designate suspected and confirmed acute flaccid myelitis (AFM) as reportable in Iowa. This designation will begin on January I, 2023 and remain in place until December 31, 2023.

All lowa healthcare providers are required to report suspected or confirmed cases of AFM to the department's disease notification hotline at I-800-362-2736 within three days of case identification. Report any illness that meets the following criteria:

- A person with onset of acute flaccid<sup>1</sup> limb weakness, AND
- A magnetic resonance image showing a spinal cord lesion in at least some gray<sup>2</sup> matter
- Excluding persons with gray<sup>2</sup> matter lesions in the spinal cord resulting from physician diagnosed malignancy, vascular disease, or anatomic abnormalities.

Low muscle tone, limp, hanging loosely, not spastic or contracted.

<sup>2</sup>Terms in the spinal cord MRI report such as "affecting mostly gray matter",

"affecting the anterior horn or anterior horn cells", "affecting the central cord",

"anterior myelitis", or "poliomyelitis" would all be consistent with this terminology.
